CLAMBAKES

Clambakes are a fantastic idea for the 4th of July, graduation parties, and summertime picnics!

You can either stop at Adelphia Seafood and pick up everything you need for your clambake or let them do the work for you, then all you have to do is take them home and STEAM!

Adelphia offers 5 different Clambakes -

Plain (includes 12 clams)

Chicken (includes ½ rotisserie chicken +12 clams)

Shrimp (includes ½ pound Gold Label shrimp +12 clams)

Combo (includes 5 ounces Andouille sausage, ¼ pound shrimp, lobster tail ¾ ounce + 6 clams)

Lobster Bake (includes 4/6 ounces lobster tail + 12 clams) All Bakes include clams, seasoned baby baked potatoes, onion, carrot, and ear of corn.

Instructions for Steaming your Clam Bake

- 1. TO ENSURE THE FRESHNESS, it is best to keep your bakes refrigerated until ready to steam.
- 2. COOKING UTENSILS: If you have one, a clam steamer is best, but if you do not, any pot or roast pan can serve as a steamer. In order that the bakes are cooked only by steam, a rack must be provided in the bottom of your pot, to keep the bakes out of the water. If you are improvising, one or more aluminum pie pans, turned upside down, will serve well as a bottom rack. A tight-fitting lid will speed your cooking time.
- 3. TIME OF PREPARATION: When you have determined what time you would like to serve your bakes, the cooking time is important. Put only enough water in your cooking utensil to cover the bottom rack. Place your bakes in the utensil and cover with a lid. Once a constant level of steam is achieved, the baking time is about 20 minutes. The easiest way to test the bakes for doneness is to pierce the onion with a fork. If it is very soft to the core, the rest of the bake is usually finished and ready to serve. It may be wise to periodically check the liquid level in the pot to make sure the bake is not cooking dry. Add additional water if necessary.
- 4. SERVING: When your bakes are nearing completion, it is time to melt the butter so you can serve your bakes with liberal cups of drawn butter. When the bakes are served, we suggest that the clams be eaten first, as the clams will cool down more rap idly than anything else in the bake, so why not have everyone enjoy them at their steamy best!
- 5. DESSERT: If you and your friends are real "clam eaters," you may want to steam up some additional clams after the bakes have been served. Bring these out as "dessert clams" after the main course.

sent us this photo of his Midget Football team. Bill said, "When I was growing up, Wyomissing grade-school boys could get involved in football by playing at three different levels - Mites, Midgets, and Juniors. The next level was high school, junior varsity, and varsity. The picture is circa 1964, probably Midgets. It was a lot of fun and I remember most of the classmates and still see some of them in the area. A number of them, including myself, eventually played at the varsity level."

We thought our Wyomissing readers would enjoy this 57-year-old photo and may be able to help us identify a few of the boys we could not. If you know any of the players we indicated as "skip," let us know and we will update this photo. We believe four of the players are now deceased.



One of the boys in the photo, Bob Diddlebock who now lives in Billings, MT, and Denver, CO, said, "Something that comes to mind about the 1964 photo is, in those mid-1960s days, the aged equipment and uniforms - were never washed or cleaned during the season and the same jerseys, pads, helmets, and pants were handed out year after year."

"Wyomissing had always been the Wyomissing Warriors." Gage said, "Our biggest rival was the West Reading Cowboys. The two schools merged in 1970 and I remember how great it was meeting many new classmates and getting additional players for the football team. The school asked all students to vote on new a team name. One option was, of course, the Spartans, another was the Trojans.

"As eighth and ninth graders, Bob Diddlebock, Scott Jones, and I were the football managers helping the high school coaches and players with various needs. Geez, did the older players ever have fun picking on us – all in good



fun! We got to go to all the games including away games. I then played varsity football starting in 10th grade."

From here, they transitioned into residential general contracting before they began building entire custom homes from the ground up. They officially started their business in February of 2011, and D&B just celebrated its 10-year anniversary.

Today, D&B Elite Custom is a residential construction firm offering services for custom homes and remodeling projects. Their remodeling projects span from powder room remodels to entire master suite renovations or home additions. They have completed many unique projects for clients, including custom outdoor living spaces and even an NBA-sized basketball court.

The D&B Elite team is comprised of dedicated individuals who anchor themselves to one of the hallmarks of the company's business model - People come first at D&B. This mindset, coupled with their quality work, has led to D&B being the recipient of many awards in the last decade, including Builder of the Year, Remodeler of the Year, Remodeling Magazine's Top 550, Qualified Remodeler 500, Lehigh Valley's 45 Fastest-Growing Businesses, Best Places to Work in PA, INC 5,000's Fastest Private Growing Companies, and Greater Reading Chamber Alliance's Top 50 Businesses.

At D&B, "we care" is more than just a tagline. Their pre-construction and selection processes are one of a kind and allow for transparent communication between the D&B Elite team and clients, so every project is completed on time, within budget, and to the customers' vision. It is one thing to be able to take an image a client saved on Pinterest of their dream kitchen and make it a reality, but it is another thing altogether when the completed job is life-changing to a client. This is a responsibility that the D&B Elite team does not take lightly.

Currently, D&B Elite Custom is working with two wonderful local families who have faced adversity head-on within recent years. At the end of May, the D&B Elite team smiled from ear to ear as they watched the Kline family start to move into their custom home, and they look forward to doing the same when the Rochino family moves into their re-imagined home soon.

A Transformation Like No Other

The feeling of seeing a client view their completed new home or renovations for the first time is always rewarding but watching the Kline family step into their new home meant so much more to the D&B Elite Custom team after all this couple has endured over the last two years. On December 14, 2019, Dave and Kathy Kline had a fire that destroyed their home. The only thing left from the house was part of the foundation, so their hand was forced to build a new home.

Their friend and President/CEO of Olsen Design Group Architects, Lee Olsen, told the couple, "There's only one choice. You've got to go with D&B. I've worked with them. They'll do a great job, pull together some amazing subcontractors, and the process will all flow very smoothly." Following the recommendation of Lee, the Klines met with D&B Elite Custom's Director of Residential Construction, Larry Adam, in January of 2020. Larry remembers walking through the house with the couple to "look over existing amenities and go over their insurance claim proposal so they could start budgeting for the rebuild based on sketches from their architect." Although the pandemic put the design process to a halt for a bit, they restarted the design phase in May of 2020, and demo of the existing structure took place in October of 2020.

"When we started the demo, Dave and Kathy were on site. This was a moment of closure for them as the house they raised their children in was torn down to make way for the new and improved version of their home," recalls Larry. He loved watching the couple's reactions as their new home progressed. "I could see their excitement as their design and selections came together and they could physically walk through what they had created on paper," he says with a smile.

The Klines made lemonade out of lemons, turning the loss of their old home into an opportunity to build a home guided by form and function. The end result was a home "more suitable for senior citizens" with everything they need all on one floor as they enter the next season of their life. Every detail of the home, from the breathtaking timber beams right down to the paint color in each room, was carefully selected with a purpose. The Klines wanted a style that was both rustic and comforting while paying homage to their travels in the mountains and Dave's 35 years of guiding ski and sightseeing groups in the Alps. Influence came from a blueprint Dave obtained in Zermatt, Switzerland, and from the architecture of northern Italy, southern Austria, and Bavaria, Germany. "It's sort of our vacation home that we live in full-time now," Dave said.

Describing their home as a "labor of love," D&B Elite Custom's Project Coordinator, Beth Varone-Barrer, says, "What they love to do and what they have experienced in life is incorporated into their new living space. Their home tells a story. Kathy told me she never thought they would be building a home at this stage in

their life. When I toured her completed home and she gave me a hug I could have cried. It made me feel so good to see her happy with her home."

The Superintendent in charge of this project, Paul Gent, says his favorite part of his career is the relationships he builds with the homeowners he completes work for. "This wasn't your everyday, normal home," reflects Paul. "The Kline house was completely customized to their liking and included memorabilia from their old house that we were able to save and incorporate into their new home, such as a custom decorative glass piece that everyone sees as soon as they walk through the front door. My reward was seeing how happy they were."

All in the Family: A Fifty-Year Milestone in Wyomissing Hills

Lori and Avelino (Av) Rochino are another local family making something beautiful out of the hand they have been dealt. "With recent life changes, such as Av's disability from an unfortunate accident and his mother's recent passing from pneumonia, we knew we were ready to make changes to accommodate our new life situation," says Lori. "With the house turning 50 years old next year, we thought this would be a great way to celebrate new beginnings!"

In 2010, Lori and Av had the opportunity to buy Av's parents' home when they retired to Florida. This allowed the Rochinos to keep the home that Av's father, Avelino Sr. built, in their family for, hopefully, generations to come. Av attended the Wyomissing School District with his older brother up until junior high. Today, their son Andre now attends the same school as a third grader. This Wyomissing Hills home was the perfect starter home for Lori and Av. "When we bought it, we knew it had plenty of potential, but since it was built in 1972 we knew we'd be making some changes one day. However, life got busy and any home improvement projects got placed on the back burner," says Lori.

The perfect storm changed all that. Lori, a marketing / communications professional for Philly and Boston-based organizations, and Av, a software engineer for a Boston-area-based company, both worked from home prior to the start of COVID-19. Life events, coupled with the fact that their son was now attending school remotely due to the pandemic, resulted in a need to make more space so everyone wasn't on top of each other. Another plus side to renovating their home? The Rochino family has close ties with extended family in western PA, NJ, and DE. These renovations will allow the family to have more space to entertain them. With interest rates at their lowest, the Rochinos knew now was the time to secure the finances to help make their renovation dreams come true.

At the beginning of April this year, D&B Elite Custom began renovations to the family's beloved home. These renovations include adding a second-floor master suite and updating every aspect of this 1970s home. In addition, the first floor will be completely ADA compliant for Av, with hardwood floors throughout, wider hallways, an open concept living plan, and a bigger shower with a flip-up seat. "When I found out that this home was Av's childhood home and they are now raising their son in it, I thought 'How cool is that?!' The Rochinos are just enjoyable to be around and easy to work with. They did their homework and knew what they wanted to achieve. We are excited to make their ideas a reality," says D&B's Project Coordinator, Beth.

When Lori and Av contacted D&B Elite Custom, they had some ideas but didn't know what to expect, as this was their first home renovation project. Fire Not Part of Their 60-Year Celebration

As a result of a two-alarm fire on Feb 19, 2021, Western

Berks Ambulance Association's Station 1, located on Belmont Avenue in West Lawn, suffered extensive damage to the building, offices, vehicle fleet, and medical equipment, as well as a loss of medical and office supplies. Thanks to the quick response of area emergency services providers, the damages were not more severe. No one was injured, the vehicles, equipment and supplies will be replaced, and the building is in the process of being restored.

The Western Berks Ambulance Association extends their sincere gratitude to every fellow first responder who helped both on the scene of the fire and behind the scenes so WBAA could continue to provide 24/7 emergency medical services to residents of the municipalities served. This year, Western Berks is celebrating its 60th Anniversary as a community founded and community funded non-profit provider of top-notch emergency medical services in Berks and surrounding counties. While celebration events are planned for 2021, the fire was not part of those plans.

Anthony Tucci, Executive Director of WBAA, told us the restoration has been difficult. "We had to terminate our agreement with our first remediation company, the second company just started. We had to bring in an architectural firm to complete a set of drawings for a level 3 restoration. We lost one vehicle entirely, and we do not expect the delivery of a new unit until late August due to the Covid related delay in microprocessors. Our other truck that had smoke damage is now on its third cleaning."

Tucci continued, "We have received numerous donations, but we need more help. We run on a very tight budget with some help from our surrounding municipalities with our membership program. Insurance companies do not pay for the cost of readiness and only pay a fraction of the entire bill leaving the rest on us, so every little bit helps, and we are grateful to the community for helping out."

WBEMS administrative services are temporarily operating from rented office space in Sinking Spring. Their ambulances from the West Lawn location are being housed at the former Lower Hiedelberg Fire Company and at the Township of Spring Fire Department building, which generously donated the temporary use of their facility.

Funded by memberships and donations, Western Berks Ambulance Association has been a strong and sustainable non-profit organization that continues to grow within Berks County and beyond. Over the past year, Western Berks has expanded its coverage area to 17 municipalities and added two additional stations.

Since 1961, Western Berks Ambulance Association has provided EMS services to western Berks County. WBAA currently has 55 Paramedics and 68 emergency medical technicians on staff and last year responded to over 15,000 calls with their current fleet of 14 ambulances and nine wheelchair vans all outfitted with the most advanced lifesaving technology. 

Sophia Harris, a 2021 graduate of Wyomissing Area Jr./Sr. High School, vividly recalls the first time she fell in love with ice skating. "I attended a New Year's Eve skating party when I was 7," she shared. "I loved it and I signed up for lessons and have been skating ever since."

After moving to Wyomissing from the Philadelphia Main Line four years ago, Harris discovered that this area was the perfect location to foster her love of ice skating. She specifically mentioned how understanding Wyomissing Area Jr./Sr. High School Principal, Dr. Corey Jones, was whenever she had to miss classes due to her competition schedule. "With synchronized skating, I have gone all over the country since freshman year," she said. Over the last four years, Harris has earned an impressive number of awards, including a Triple Gold Medal in U.S. Figure Skating. She specializes in freestyle skating, ice dancing, and synchronized skating at the national level. "I've been fortunate enough to do a lot of different types of skating," she said.

Harris trains at Body Zone Sports and Wellness Complex in Wyomissing, where she also works manning the front desk, volunteering for their bridge program to attract new members, and teaching youth ice skating classes. 1966 Corvair



Roy & Sandi Kissinger - Wyomissing

"A Corvair was not what we were looking for. My son Chad and I started out searching for a '55 Chevy to buy with the idea that he and I would work on it together and by the time he turned 16, he would have a good appreciation of cars. At that time, '55s were so high priced we didn't find one." said Roy Kissinger as he and his wife Sandi gave me the history of their 1966 Corvair Monza.

"We were at a flea market in Shillington talking to someone about our search for a car, and they told us about this '66. I wasn't too interested at first, but they said it was a Monza which is a sportier version, and it

was a convertible - that got my attention - so we went to look at it. It was owned by a very old man who was the second owner of the car. I took it for a drive and fell in love with it. This was 1987 when we bought it making us the third owner. It is the original color that I had re-painted once. It has the original interior. It is a three-speed on floor, and it isn't an easy three-speed to drive. It's not like today's cars with fuel injection where you have immediate response. There is a fine balance between the gas and the clutch because it has two carburetors that are connected with all the linkage instead of modern electronics. I told my grandson Coen, if you can drive this, you can drive any stick or any manual transmission vehicle. He drove it to the Exeter Junior Prom this year. There were kids at the prom looking at the Corvair and they were asking what this one knob was for - it was the crank for the window."

Sandi said, "We drive it spring, summer, and fall - May through November. When the weather is nice we take it out, mostly with the top down. We got caught in the rain twice where we got soaked and had to stop and put the top up. It has been a lot of fun over the years."

The Corvair was Chevrolet's answer to Japanese imports and the Volkswagen Beetle. The Corvair's engine was rear-mounted and air-cooled - the first such mass-produced American car with those features. Selling for half the price of a Ford Thunderbird, it was an answer to the clamor for economy compacts. Other



cars to follow suit were the Ford Falcon and Plymouth Valiant.

In his 1965 book *Unsafe at Any Speed*, the outspoken political activist Ralph Nader claimed that the Chevrolet Corvair was the most dangerous automobile on the road in the 1960s. While Nader certainly made some valid points, most Corvair owners will tell you Nader was full of baloney and the Corvair is an amazing car that was dealt a dirty hand by Nader.
